911 Services Department

The Tama County E911 Executive Service Board meeting was called to order at 5:30 PM

January 17, 2017 by Chairman Boll (Toledo). Members present: Billie Van Egmond (Dysart), Sheriff Dennis Kucera, Gordon Fassett (Clutier), Mindy Benson EMA/911 Coordinator, Jeremy Cremeans Assistant EMA/911 Coordinator. Also Present were Kendall Jordan, and Dave Svoboda.

Motion by Fassett, second by Van Egmond to approve agenda. All ayes. Motion carried.

Mindy presented the members with a proposal of the items for the budget hearing and set the date for the 911 budget hearing for February 7, 2017.

Mindy and Jeremy presented information to the board about the current billing status of the Meskwaki Nation Police Department billing, as noted on the executive board agenda the item of delinquent billing and been paid and all claims are currently up to date. Also discussed was the agenda item of the updated billing for fiscal year 2017/2018, as per stated in the contract with Meskwaki Nation Police Department (MNPD) and the Sac & Fox Tribe of the Mississippi billing would be readdressed on a yearly basis, unfortunately that had not been done since 2010. Mindy and Jeremy had provided budget numbers and followed the formula that was derived in the original signed contract back 2007 to come up with an annual reimbursement for fiscal year 17/18 of \$63,348.30 which would make quarterly payments \$15,837.08. A letter will be sent to MNPD as well as Chris Nydle their Tribal Attorney to let them know of the updated quarterly payments.

Mindy and Jeremy requested guidance from the executive board regarding 911 addressing requests from Windstream and Mr. & Mrs. George Vileta.

Windstream was requesting to have their junction boxes that sit on the county right of way in ditches along fence lines addressed, due to those boxes needing utilities ran to them for power and other items. The Executive Board decided that since they are not technically a “structure” and sit on the county right of way they will not be eligible for 911 addressing for those reasons. Windstream did withdraw their request for a 911 address prior to the meeting addressing this request. This decision will hold for any and all future requests.

In the request of Mr. & Mrs. George Vileta they were requesting 911 address for their farm fields located in the 3100-block of Highway 21 and 3000-block of V Avenue the Executive Board decided that the code currently would provide them with a 911 address if the property had/has a building. Since research indicated we could not find any buildings on the property dating back to 1990’s there would not be a 911 address provided. Mindy will send a letter to the Vileta’s explaining the
